Conflict Analysis and Resolution or
Family Therapy**

The fields of conflict analysis and resolution and family therapy share a focus on improving relationships for individuals, families, organizations, and communities through constructive approaches to conflict and effective interventions.

Dual admission majors are available for qualified freshmen and transfer students interested in these growing fields. Students must complete the baccalaureate degree and all prerequisite coursework before entering either the conflict analysis and resolution or family therapy programs.

Graduate School of Humanities and Social Sciences (SHSS)

On completion of the baccalaureate degree, and after meeting all program requirements, students will be admitted to the Graduate School of Humanities and Social Sciences (SHSS) to complete the master of science degree in conflict analysis and resolution or in family therapy. These interdisciplinary programs draw from the fields of sociology, education, business, law, anthropology, family therapy, cybernetics, social work, and psychology. Students develop advanced skills and opportunities for rewarding careers in corporate and community dispute settlement, human resources, social service agencies, private and public education, business consultation, court-related mediation, public policy development, and private practice.

The Department of Conflict Analysis and Resolution also has a joint program with the NSU Shepard Broad Law Center. Additional offerings at SHSS include an online graduate certificate program in conflict analysis and resolution; an online or residential master's degree in college student personnel administration; an online or residential graduate certificate in peace studies; and a specialization, which can be taken either online or at the main campus, in health care conflict resolution.

The Department of Family Therapy offers a specialization in family systems health care, as well as a graduate certificate in family studies, and operates the Brief Therapy Institute as the primary clinical training facility for graduate students.
